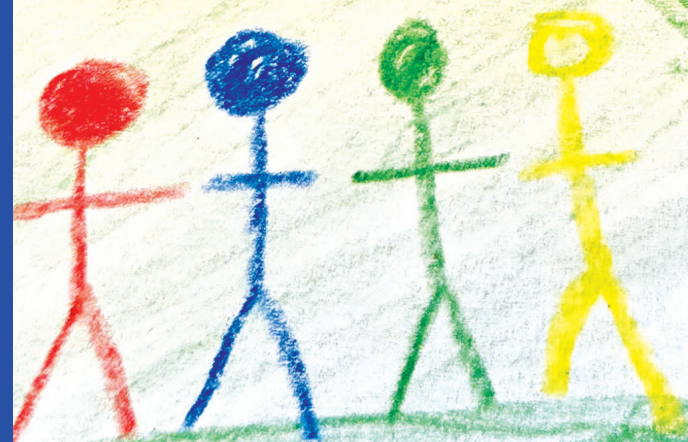

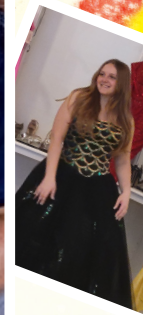

Did you know?

Our Diaper Bank is providing around **12,000** diapers a month to families in our service area. The collective efforts of Toasty Toddler and Stuff the Bus provided over **1,200 kids** with warm winter wear and school supplies last year. Two hundred and seventeen teens and special-needs adults were provided with free formal wear for prom/Night to Shine through Glass Slipper Project.
